

Articulated Agreement For Dual Degree Programs (B.A., B.S.) Between Northern State University and Dakota State University

I. PARTIES

The parties to this agreement are Dakota State University (DSU), Madison, SD, and Northern State University (NSU), Aberdeen, SD.

II. INTRODUCTION

Dakota State University and Northern State University desire to establish a dual degree program leading concurrently to the Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) degree from Northern State University and the Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree from Dakota State University. Each student enrolled in the Dual Degree Program will be required to complete the requirements for the student's intended major of NSU's B.A. Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice and the student's intended major of DSU's B.S. Cyber Leadership and Intelligence or B.S. Network and Security Administration.¹ When completed, each student in the Dual Degree Program shall be awarded the appropriate degree from each respective institution. This Articulated Agreement applies to students enrolling at Northern State University and Dakota State University in Fall 2025 and thereafter.

Objectives of the Agreement

1. To leverage the mission of each institution and the online delivery of these degree programs at each institution by developing a partnership between NSU and DSU to create options for NSU students and DSU students that currently do not exist at their home institutions.
2. To streamline the ability of students to earn two degrees concurrently from NSU and DSU.
3. To provide specific advisement for NSU students pursuing a B.A. Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice degree who intend to pursue a B.S. Cyber Leadership and Intelligence degree or a B.S. Network and Security Administration degree from DSU.
4. To provide specific advisement for DSU students pursuing a B.S. Cyber Leadership and Intelligence degree or a B.S. Network and Security Administration degree who intend to pursue a B.A. Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice degree from NSU.
5. To encourage academic and administrative coordination between the two institutions, thereby exchanging outcome information of the programs with the goal of continuous improvement.
6. To provide qualified NSU students the opportunity to complete a B.A. Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice degree from NSU while concurrently completing a B.S. Cyber Leadership and Intelligence degree or a B.S. Network and Security Administration degree from DSU.
7. To provide qualified DSU students the opportunity to complete a B.S. Cyber Leadership and Intelligence degree or a B.S. Network and Security Administration degree from DSU while concurrently completing a B.A. Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice degree from NSU.

III. ACADEMIC PROGRAM

1. NSU students enrolled in the B.A. Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice program must apply for the B.S. in Cyber Leadership and Intelligence or the B.S. in Network and Security Administration at DSU during the first two years of their program.² During the semester after application submission, students who meet all requirements will be formally accepted into the B.S. Cyber Leadership and Intelligence or B.S. Network and Security Administration program at DSU and can begin concurrent enrollment at DSU the following semester.
2. DSU students enrolled in the B.S. Cyber Leadership and Intelligence or the B.S. Network and Security Administration program at DSU must apply for the B.A. in Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice at NSU during the first two years of their program.³ During the semester after application submission, students who meet all requirements will be formally accepted into the B.A. Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice program at NSU and can begin concurrent enrollment at NSU the following semester.
3. For students beginning this Dual Degree Program at NSU, upon successful completion of the required NSU coursework specified below, DSU will offer a guarantee of admission to the B.S. Cyber Leadership and Intelligence program or the B.S. Network and Security Administration program in this agreement and accept coursework in the NSU B.A. Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice program.
4. For students beginning this Dual Degree Program at DSU, upon successful completion of the required DSU coursework specified below, NSU will offer a guarantee of admission to the B.A. Criminal Justice/ Criminology and Criminal Justice program in this agreement and accept coursework in the DSU B.S. Cyber Leadership and Intelligence or the B.S. Network and Security Administration program.
5. Students at each institution must meet all South Dakota Board of Regents (SDBOR) policies, system graduation requirements (see Attachment 1), and each institution's graduation requirements to receive a degree from each institution (see the institutional credit requirement exception set forth in item 12 below).
6. All courses taken to complete the general education requirements set forth by the SDBOR will count toward completion of both programs, i.e., the B.A. in Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice from NSU and the B.S. in Cyber Leadership and Intelligence or the B.S. in Network and Security Administration from DSU.
7. When starting the DSU program in B.S. Cyber Leadership and Intelligence or in B.S. Network and Security Administration, students are expected to have a strong background in programming and information technology. To fulfill this expectation, NSU's B.A. Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice students must complete CSC 150 Computer Science I in addition to the required coursework for DSU's B.S. in Cyber Leadership and Intelligence or the B.S. in Network and Security Administration.
8. Requirements to be completed at NSU and at DSU to earn a B.A. Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice degree (NSU) concurrently with a B.S. Cyber Leadership and Intelligence degree (DSU) (see Attachment 2A and Attachment 2B) or a B.S. Network and Security Administration degree (DSU) (see Attachment 3A and Attachment 3B) are outlined below.
9. Students must complete all requirements of the NSU B.A. Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice degree to earn a B.A. Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice degree from NSU. Students must complete all requirements of the DSU B.S. Cyber Leadership and Intelligence degree or the B.S. Network and Security Administration degree to earn a B.S. Cyber Leadership and Intelligence or a B.S. Network and Security Administration degree from DSU.

10. Students must successfully complete all required courses in the NSU B.A. Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice major with a "C" or higher in each course for this agreement to apply (see NSU Required Courses for Degree Program in Attachments 2A, 2B, 3A, and 3B).
11. Student must successfully complete all required courses in the DSU B.S. Cyber Leadership and Intelligence program or the B.S. Network and Security Administration program maintaining a minimum 2.0 GPA for this agreement to apply (see DSU Required Courses for Degree Program in Attachments 2A, 2B, 3A, and 3B).
12. DSU and NSU agree to waive the following undergraduate degree granting institutional credit requirement set forth in item III.D. of [BOR Policy 2.6.1](#): baccalaureate degree-seeking students must complete 15 of the last 30 credit hours earned preceding completion of the degree from the degree-granting institution. Specifically, DSU and NSU agree to waive the requirement that students must complete 15 of the last 30 credit hours earned preceding completion of the requirements for the NSU baccalaureate degree in NSU institutional credit and 15 of the last 30 credit hours earned preceding completion of the requirements for the DSU baccalaureate degree in DSU institutional credit.
13. Students must meet all NSU and DSU Graduation Requirements, including those set forth in [BOR Policy 2.6.1](#), with the exception of item III.D. as set forth above, to graduate with a B.A. Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice degree from NSU and a B.S. Cyber Leadership and Intelligence degree or a B.S. Network and Security Administration degree from DSU.
14. Students must meet all Higher Learning Commission (HLC) residency requirements to graduate with a B.A. in Criminal Justice/B.A. Criminology and Criminal Justice degree from NSU and a B.S. in Cyber Leadership and Intelligence degree or a B.S. in Network and Security Administration degree from DSU.⁴ Specifically, students must complete a minimum of 30 of the last 120 credits earned preceding completion of the B.A. in Criminal Justice/B.A. Criminology and Criminal Justice degree in NSU institutional credit AND a minimum of 30 of the last 120 credits earned preceding completion of the B.S. in Cyber Leadership and Intelligence degree or a B.S. in Network and Security Administration degree in DSU institutional credit.
15. Students retain the right to transfer from NSU to DSU at any point or from DSU to NSU at any point, in accordance with SDBOR policies.⁵

IV. PROCEDURES

1. NSU students are required to submit all application materials to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions at DSU by the application deadline set by DSU's Office of Undergraduate Admissions, and DSU students are required to submit all application materials to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions at NSU by the application deadline set by NSU's Office of Undergraduate Admissions. International students should contact both the NSU and DSU Offices of International Affairs to coordinate the transfer of their Student and Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS) record (Form I-20).
2. As part of this Dual Degree Program, NSU students pursuing a B.A. in Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice will have their DSU application fee waived when applying for the B.S. in Cyber Leadership and Intelligence or the B.S. in Network and Security Administration program at DSU.
3. As part of this Dual Degree Program, DSU students pursuing a B.S. in Cyber Leadership and Intelligence or a B.S. in Network and Security Administration will have their NSU application fee waived when applying for the B.A. in Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice program at NSU.

4. NSU students with a declared major in Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice must declare a major in Cyber Leadership and Intelligence or a major in Network and Security Administration at the time of application to DSU.
5. DSU students with a declared major in Cyber Leadership and Intelligence or a declared major in Network and Security Administration must declare a major in Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice at the time of application to NSU.
6. General Education requirements taken at other institutions or credit awarded by advanced placement, concurrent enrollment, pathway credits, equivalency or individual testing will be accepted as fulfillment of General Education requirements for this Dual Degree Program as long as the course credit appears on the transcript issued by NSU or DSU.

V. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

1. This program is concurrent. Students whose home institution is NSU will pay tuition and fees directly to NSU when enrolled in this concurrent Dual Degree Program. Students whose home institution is DSU will pay tuition and fees directly to DSU when enrolled in this concurrent Dual Degree Program. Each institution is solely responsible for setting its own tuition and fee rates.
2. Students who are eligible may request financial aid through their home institution – students whose home institution is NSU may request financial aid through NSU; students whose home institution is DSU may request financial aid through DSU. While students are enrolled in this concurrent Dual Degree Program the respective financial aid offices will be responsible for monitoring eligibility and processing awards. Any withdrawn student receiving federal student aid will be subject to federal regulations as it relates to the return of any unearned federal student aid.

VI. OBLIGATIONS

Both parties agree to confer with each other on a regular basis regarding changes in curricula involved in this agreement. Additionally:

1. NSU will develop advising sheets and related materials delineating educational pathways and provide advising to NSU students pursuing the B.A. in Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice concurrently with the B.S. in Cyber Leadership and Intelligence or the B.S. in Network and Security Administration at DSU while enrolled as NSU students.
2. DSU will develop advising sheets and related materials delineating educational pathways and provide advising to DSU students pursuing the B.S. in Cyber Leadership and Intelligence or the B.S. in Network and Security Administration concurrently with the B.A. in Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice at NSU while enrolled as DSU students.
3. NSU and DSU will work cooperatively to market this concurrent educational pathway; all marketing materials must be approved by both NSU and DSU.
4. All required courses for the NSU B.A. Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice degree are available online, and all courses for the DSU B.S. Cyber Leadership and Intelligence degree and the B.S. in Network and Security Administration degree are available online. The online delivery of each program allows students at NSU and at DSU to complete all courses for their Dual Degree Program without having to relocate from their home institution.
5. NSU and DSU both agree to encourage qualified students to participate in this Dual Degree Program through advisement and information dissemination.
6. The relevant professional advisors for each degree program at each institution (i.e., B.A. Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice at NSU and B.S. Cyber Leadership and Intelligence or B.S. Network

and Security Administration at DSU) will maintain a list of students pursuing the Dual Degree Program. The relevant NSU professional advisor will notify the relevant DSU professional advisor of NSU students intending to enroll in the B.S. Cyber Leadership and Intelligence or the B.S. Network and Security Administration program at DSU to facilitate necessary communication with the DSU Admissions Office. The relevant DSU professional advisors will notify the relevant NSU professional advisor of DSU students intending to enroll in the B.A. Criminal Justice/Criminology and Criminal Justice program at NSU to facility necessary communication with the NSU Admissions Office. Per DSU policy, as dual degree students enter their junior year, they will transition from professional advisors to faculty advisors for the DSU portion of their dual degree.

VII. MODIFICATIONS

1. As program graduation requirements change at either institution, this agreement shall be updated by communicating the changes in the form of attachments to this agreement and will not, in and of itself, require revision of the agreement.
2. Curricular changes to either degree program in this Dual Degree Program Articulated Agreement will be communicated in a timely manner to enable either institution the opportunity to review the changes and decide if they are significant enough to warrant revising or terminating the agreement.
3. This agreement may be modified from time to time by the SDBOR. Modifications may not diminish the entitlements enjoyed by students who have already attended classes delivered under the terms of earlier versions of the agreement, except in rare instances in which retroactive implementation of modifications may be required to comply with accreditation standards or to conform to professional licensure requirements.

VIII. EFFECTIVE DATE OF AGREEMENT

This agreement will go into effect at the start of the Fall 2025 semester at NSU and at DSU.

BA program requirements of 52 are reduced by 6 credits by counting CJUS 201 as fulfilling a BA program requirement while also fulfilling one SGR#3 requirement and by counting POLS 100 as fulfilling a BA program elective requirement while also fulfilling the SGR#3 Civics Requirement. These 6 credits are counted within the total credits for SGRs above.

Total credits BS program requirements (without 18 credit specialization): 42

BS program requirements of 54 are reduced by 12 credits by counting ENGL 212 as fulfilling a BS program requirement while also fulfilling SGR#4, and by counting HIST 468, POLS 350, and SOC 370 as fulfilling BS program requirements while also fulfilling BA program requirements. Three of these 12 credits are counted within the total credits for SGRs above, and the remaining 9 credits are counted within the total credits for BA program requirements above.

BS program requirements of 90 credits are reduced by 31 credits by counting MATH 281 as fulfilling a BS program requirement while also fulfilling SGR#5, by waiving CSC 407, CSC 437, CSC 443, CSC 494/CSC 498 (12 credits total), and by waiving 16 credits of BS program elective requirements. The 3 credits for MATH 281 are counted within the total credits for SGRs above.
